RE: Local knowledge of surface water flooding in Westfield

The main problem is the poor maintenance of drains, and the locations thereof. The situation is a scandal at St Peter's Glade. Otherwise there are some car parks which naturally get flooded in the worst downpours. I suggest a policy of encouraging the use of that greencrete stuff for carparks where practicable, monitoring drains, and objecting to anything that will prevent the hillsides being natural sponges. The Waterside/Snails Brook are needs to be kept clear to enable natural drainage. The green open spaces (so called) serve the same function. We ought to uphold the government policy on not allowing concreting over of gardens. (2010 policy still holds good, I think) The mature trees in the Waterside estate and the poets estate also have important functions in keeping the verges drained.

High flood risk is in the area by the Miner's Pool and the graveyard. We once had so much water in the Westfield end of the graveyard that someone slipped and fell into the grave itself. (2008) The other issue is the retaining walls, which can be badly affected and collapse if there is too much rain. Again, the drainage should be watched. What about the little industrial estate behind Costcutter? Bet that floods.

I think the BANES website has the information, but it is an under-estimate. The Waterside is 1:50, I am fairly sure, but we had floods in 2009 and 2013, so it does not follow that after one flood there will not be another for 50 years! Most of Westfield is 1:100 according to BANES. However, both figures are river generated floods, not run off. Hope that helps.
