



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

Hi Lesley,

Just to let you know the vandals have struck again.

This time it is near and around the car park and partly up the drive from the car park, the fence has been pulled away from the iron top supports which have been twisted away from the fencing. One section of fence has been cut and rejoined again by twisting together, that's in the car park — not sure by whom — the working party haven't mentioned anything about doing a temporary fix to the fencing and they know I report any damage to the green, club or surrounding area to the council. I will ask them tomorrow.

Also I noticed that the top of our large fence around the green has been pulled down into a toe hole – again I know the men have been mending these holes or parts of cut fencing - been quite a few at the back of the changing rooms, over the last couple of weeks but I will check on Monday to see if it's one that has been missed or it's a new one. Also I notice that no repair has ever been done to the damaged fencing at the top of the drive – just the temporary fix that the Councillor did on the night – is that because the vandals are more than likely to come and rip it all off again?

Since going back to a little more normality at the club and the members having evening roll ups we've noticed that teenagers kick a football against the end house's side wall, even bouncing off into the estate and once hitting the bonnet of a parked car, suppose that's the responsibility of the owners or perhaps they can't hear it but then again I don't suppose there is much that can be done about that. Several times pulling the netting on the tennis court back and forth quite hard - not the same people as these were young kids – don't know whether your cameras pick any of that up – we've seen that a few times. Dare not say anything because they would then turn their attention to the club premises.

Perhaps, in the next spending review the council could fund some CCTV cameras for the premises, after all, I would have thought it's the Council's responsibility, under the Miners Welfare Trust, to ensure the property is safe from vandalism.

Are these two grounds maintained/run by the Parish Council, if so, you can erect notices up advising dog owners not to go on the pitches and to walk around them, pick up after their dogs etc. If not maintained by the Parish Council and by B&NES the fouling can be reported on our Fix My Street app on our website, this goes straight to cleansing and they will arrange for cleansing team to attend.

There is also the option of the Public Spaces Protection Orders under the Anti-Social Crime & Policing Act 2014 where you can get dogs banned from going on the recreational facilities, it entails evidence gathering and will have to go through the council, however, Bristol council have a few in place and find it has been very beneficial.

I have not used the spray method for quite some time as members of the public started to take it into their own hands and were using paint spray that was not suitable, causing various issues.

I will get authorisation to order some spray in and will visit the site(s) as soon as I can.

Biodiversity Net Gain / Somer Valley

Dear all

As you may already know that, as part of the new Environment Bill, developers will need to demonstrate part 10% biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) on qualifying developments. Ideally this net gain of biodiversity is delivered on-site but in some instances where this is impossible they may be allowed to achieve this 10% increase off-site. In return for the off site improvements the developer has to provide funding for a minimum of 30years management to achieve stated habitat creation and improvements. More info on BNG can be found here: https://www.biodiversityinplanning.org/news/bd-net-gain/

B&NES Council is looking for land that may be suitable for off site BNG and at this stage it is literally a list of sites to be explored further. Before a final decision is made there would need to be baseline BNG calculations and habitat masterplans carried out and this would be the next stage. Most of the sites listed so far are around Bath and Keynsham but it would be good to see some in the Somer Valley too. The sites that immediately spring to mind are Haydon Batch, Waterside Valley and Midsomer Norton Town Park but there may be others.

The benefits of having a site selected for BNG is that it has the potential to bring in funding for long term management.

Could you let me know whether you would be interested in exploring this further? I can then set up a meeting with Karen Renshaw, the council ecologist who is leading on BNG. We will have to act quite quickly as the list of potential sites needs to be completed by early June.

Re: Bath & North East Somerset Council Tree & Woodland Delivery Plan and Ethos



I am writing to you as a potential stakeholder in relation to the above plan. We have recently commissioned Ethos to research and write the plan for us (it will comprise both urban and rural sections) and as part of their work they are asked to contact potential key urban stakeholders such as yourselves in order to find out more about your interests in relation to tree and woodland planting in urban areas of Bath and North East Somerset (B&NES). They will also ask a limited number of additional questions to help us to clarify how we as B&NES Council can best use our own limited resources, possibly in partnership with yourselves or in a way which seeks to break down barriers to successful delivery of planting in urban B&NES.

As background and simple context to the B&NES Tree and Woodland Delivery Plan, the Council is committed to the following key principles:

- Make strenuous efforts to fulfil its ambition to plant 100,000 trees by May 2023 with partnerships and communities
- Contributing effectively to the West of England Nature Partnership's ambition to double woodland cover in the West of England (WoE) by 2060
- Ensure that the B&NES Tree and Woodland Delivery Plan responds effectively to the overarching vision and ambitions of the WoE Tree and Woodland Strategy and its 5 year action plan. In order to do this most effectively we will work with the Forest of Avon Trust as our primary partner and will encourage the use of its Trees for Climate Fund wherever possible.

The West of England Combined Authority (WECA) is collating bids into the new UK Community Renewal Fund (UKCRF).

This fund has been introduced by the UK Government for 2021/22 to support people and communities most in need across the UK.

The fund, which totals £220 million, also intends to help the UK move smoothly away from the EU structural fund programme and is a pilot programme to prepare for the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

As lead for the fund in the region, the West of England Combined Authority (WECA) is calling on councils, universities, colleges, third sector organisations and others to submit applications for UKCRF funding by <u>midnight Friday 21 May 2021</u>.
