Covid precautions	Public / Father Christmas / Stewards / Staff and Councillors arranging the event		 Travel to the event – the vast majority of attendees turn up naturally at ad hoc ties, on foot. Possible congestion spots – queuing for Father Christmas and Mulled Wine and congregating around the tree. Following measures are in place: Marquees to have one back and three open sides for ventilation. Treats for children to be at the entrance where they can help themselves, with Father Christmas two metres away from the children at all times. Masks and plastic gloves to be worn by those serving refreshments. Lateral flow tests to be taken in advance by all who serve refreshments. Stewards to wear masks and to be briefed about keeping a safe distance. Mulled wine to be prepared by a member of staff who has taken a lateral flow test in advance and wears a mask whilst preparing the flasks. Reminders over the PA system for groups to keep 2 m apart. Touch points and Cross contamination – Hand sanitiser on the refreshment table. Moving around the site – the site is open and completely outdoors. Only two gazebos this year to reduce movement around the site. Communication – risk assessment to be published in advance on the Parish Council's website. Safety announcements to be made over the PA. Complying with Test and Trace QR codes at the Parish Council marquee and the Father Christmas marquee. PA announcement to this 		MEDIUM

The countdown to be done by the Brownies only through the microphone to avoid shouting. 15. Father Christmas and Elf – Both to be positioned at the back of the gazebo, with signs		
		to say pick a free gift from Father Christmas and give him a wave. Stewards at the gazebo entrance to stop children entering the gazebo. Gifts from Father Christmas to be at the entrance to the site in a sack, where children can help themselves. 16. An advisory notice to go out on Facebook and website to the effect that all adults should be double vaccinated or have a negative lateral flow test within the last 24 hours and should wear masks.
